We took in **78** new cats in the month of July (**41 kittens, 37 cats**). We achieved a 97% live save rate in July, maintaining our overall save rate of 99%.


We performed 68 on-site surgeries in July. Thirty-two were spays and 36 were neuters. Having an onsite vet is highly beneficial as it ensures quicker access to medical care, which can be critical for early diagnosis and treatment. It also significantly reduces transport time, which minimizes stress for the cats, as they remain in a familiar environment without the added anxiety of travel.

Adoption Statistics

We received 117 adoption applications this month, leading to 52 cats getting adopted, which is down 29.7% over last July. That's 44 forever homes!




Single cat adoptions

We've saved a total of 519 cats in 2025 so far. We're 44% towards our goal of saving 1,160 cats this year.


Adoption Center Statistics

The three month old trio came to us from Indiana where they got all the medical care they needed, but there wasn't space for them to wait until they were adopted. When our shelter partner asked if we would take them in, we did so gladly.

Thankfully, all three siblings are now settled in a loving foster home, where they're getting the care and comfort they need to heal.

Paw Print Club

Our monthly donation membership, Paw Print Club, allows supporters to sign up for automatic monthly donations that go towards the shelter, rehabilitation, food, supplies, and medical care of homeless cats who have been abandoned and neglected.

This month, we welcomed 6 new members to the Paw Print Club, bringing our total number of dedicated donors to 263. Thanks to their consistent generosity, we've been able to ensure that every cat in our care receives the love and attention they need to thrive.


