This May 2025 also signified half a decade of life saving and community building as we reached five years since Paws and Claws was founded.

Commemoration of this milestone culminated at our inaugural gala, The Catalyst Ball, on May 17th when we were joined by 200 people for an evening of celebration and critical funds raised.

Rescue Statistics

We took in **104** new cats in the month of May **(64 kittens, 40 cats).** We achieved a 100% live save rate in May, maintaining our overall save rate of 99% in 2025.

Of the 104 cats we took in, many had characteristics that align with our mission of saving vulnerable cats from euthanasia. We've observed that the most common attributes leading to euthanasia decisions in shelters include black cats, bonded pairs, behaviorally challenged cats (shy or aggressive), and cats with medical needs.

Ella Enchanted Can Breathe Again

Ella Enchanted came to us struggling to breathe comfortably. At first glance, we thought she just had a bad upper respitory infection. After medicine didn't change her symptoms, Dr. Youn decided to examine her throat under anesthesia. That's when she identified a throat polyp and removed it.

Ella began breathing easily right away. If she hadn't come to us, her condition might have gone unnoticed in a crowded shelter system, and her chance to live a pain-free life could have been lost.

She's been recovering in a foster home and is one step closer to finding her forever home!

Adoption Statistics

We received 129 adoption applications this month, leading to 63 cats getting adopted, which is up 16.7% over last May. That's 51 forever homes!




Single cat adoptions

We've saved a total of 364 cats in 2025 so far. We're 31% towards our goal of saving 1,160 cats this year.


Adoption Center Statistics

Meet Half Baked, Phish Food and Chunky Monkey

In May, we welcomed 63 kittens, three of which were Half Baked, Chunky Monkey, and Phish Food. At just a month old, they needed special care and support in a foster home.

Kitten season is the time of year when unspayed cats give birth most frequently. A single cat can produce multiple litters during this time, and across the country, thousands of kittens are born daily. The result is a flood of vulnerable, tiny lives in shelters where euthanasia decisions are made.

The 63 kittens we saved is just a glimpse of how intense kitten season can be. Without fosters and community support, they wouldn't stand a chance.

That's why our partnership with Evanston Animal Shelter is so critical. Together, we're working to trap, neuter, and return (TNR) community cats —an essential step in preventing unplanned litters and reducing the cycle of suffering.

Paw Print Club

Our monthly donation membership, Paw Print Club, allows supporters to sign up for automatic monthly donations that go towards the shelter, rehabilitation, food, supplies, and medical care of homeless cats who have been abandoned and neglected.

This month, we welcomed 6 new members to the Paw Print Club, bringing our total number of dedicated donors to 259. Thanks to their consistent generosity, we've been able to ensure that every cat in our care receives the love and attention they need to thrive.

This May we increased our total cats in Foster Care by 44 cats—a **36%** growth over last month! We also increased our number of Active Foster parents by **16** compared to April.

Meet Mrs. Lovett, One of Our Longest Residents

Mrs. Lovett came to us on May 15, and remains one of the longest cats in our care. As a black cat living with feline leukemia virus, she faces multiple layers of bias.

Black cats are often overlooked in shelters due to the misconception that they're less friendly or less photogenic. On top of that, FeLV+ cats are frequently passed over. They can't live with cats who don't have the virus, and many people worry about their health.

But Mrs. Lovett is thriving in one of our loving foster homes. She's a little shy, but incredibly sweet and full of personality. She'll stay safe and cared for in foster until we find the perfect family for her.

Volunteers help unload and organize everything—it's a big effort that keeps our foster program and operations running.

On May 7, we hosted another Reading to Cats event in partnership with the Robert Crown Community Center, continuing a program that has brought joy to both children and cats since its launch in 2024. This initiative provides a calming and enriching experience, allowing elementary school students to practice their reading skills in a judgment-free environment while helping our cats grow more comfortable with children.



Bondi's spay marked our 500th onsite surgery! She was born in our care as one of Sea Glass's kittens and has been with us since day one.

Just over a year ago, we began performing surgeries onsite, and it's completely changed the way we care for our cats. With a veterinary team and surgical suite in-house, we can now diagnose, treat, and perform surgeries much faster, without the stress of sending animals elsewhere.

What used to take days or even weeks can now happen in just a few hours. That means less stress for the cats and better outcomes overall. After her milestone spay, Bondi found her forever home and was adopted on May 16.
